

PEOPLE FOR GROWTH

According to an in-depth study of the Czech labour market conducted by Augur Consulting, more than 87% of Czechs are able to speak at least one foreign language, about 28% two foreign languages and nearly 25% three foreign languages. English, German, Russian, French, Spanish, Italian, Polish and Slovak are the most widely spoken foreign languages in the Czech Republic. The table below provides another view of language skills – the number of students that learn required languages.

BRINGING LIFE TO TECHNOLOGY

Dixons Retail plc is one of Europe's leading specialist electronics retailing groups. It sells consumer electronics, personal computers, domestic appliances, photographic equipment, communication products and related services. The company does business online and through a network of more than 1,200 stores spanning 28 countries and employs 36,500 people. Dixons Retail is the number-one market leader in the UK & Ireland, Scandinavia and Greece.

The Group's Shared Services Centre in Brno opened in September 2007. Since then it has grown to provide a wide range of other services such as accounts payable, accounts receivable, finance support, e-commerce marketing and software development, customer support and group IS support.

Brno was chosen as the centre's location because it best fulfilled the selection criteria (including workforce availability, quality and cost of available office space, regional tax policy and political stability) in comparison with Prague and other potential locations in Central and Western Europe. Future expansion of the centre is planned.

"We were searching for a stable location with the potential for finding trained specialists at a reasonable price, people who would be motivated by the possibility of having a career in a powerful pan-European group," said Kevin O'Byrne, former Chief Financial Officer, Dixons Retail.

Currently the company employs over 270 people supporting 14 countries in seven languages and offers a range of part-time and full-time positions.


- How many SSCs are located in the Czech Republic?

 Most of the business support services centres are located in Prague, Brno and Ostrava. There are also centres in other regions such as Plzeň and Pardubice.
